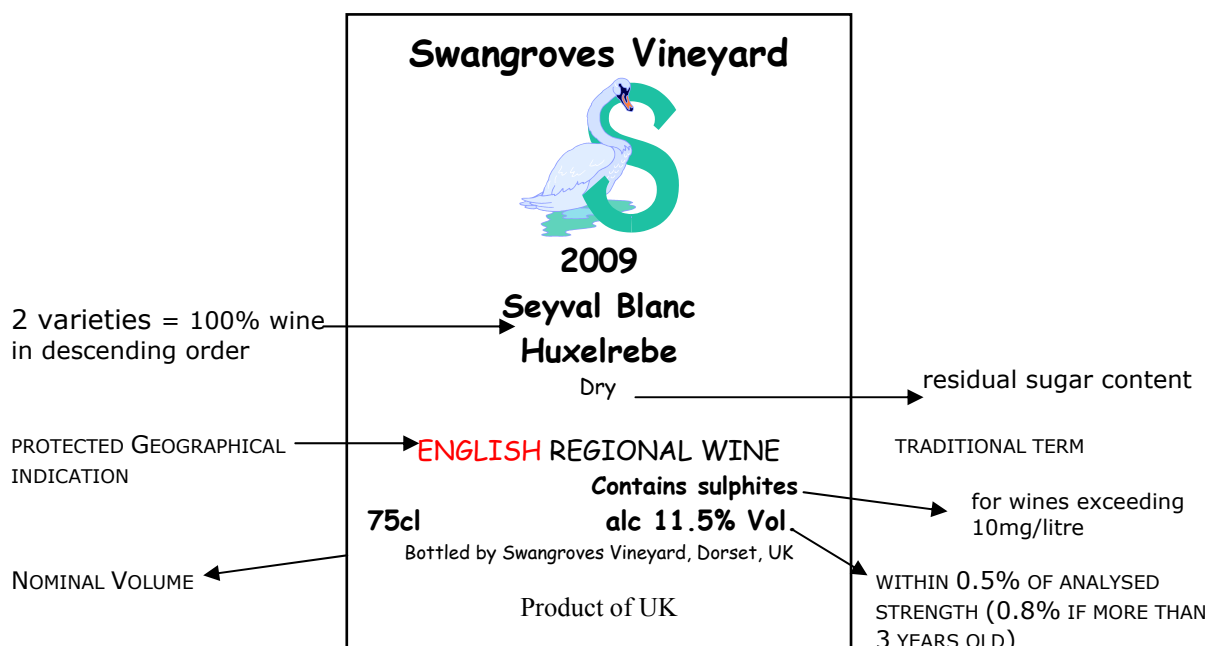


1. Regional Wine



Regional Wine comes into the wine category Protected Geographical Indication (PGI).

The geographical indications and traditional terms subject to EC confirmation* are

- English Regional Wine
- Welsh Regional Wine

“Protected Geographical Indication” may replace or supplement “Regional Wine”

2. Quality Wine

Quality Wine falls into the wine category Protected Designation of Origin (PDO). “Protected Designation of Origin” may replace or supplement “Quality Wine”

The designations and traditional terms subject to EC confirmation * are

- English Quality Wine
- Welsh Quality Wine

In other respects Quality Wine and Regional Wine must comply with the requirements set out in *EU Still wine regulations – Protected Designation of Origin/Protected Geographical Indication* (Guide to the Law section).

*The geographical indications and designations must be notified before 31st December 2011 by DEFRA to the European Commission for continued use. The Commission may cancel protection of any designation which does not meet definitions, up till 31st December 2014.

3. Wine without Protected Geographical Indication or Protected Designation of Origin



One or more vine varieties and/or the vintage year may be shown provided that the wine is part of the Varietal Wine Scheme which is subject to annual verification by Wine Standards to ensure the accuracy of these descriptions.

A well defined smaller or larger geographical unit than the protected designation of origin or protected geographical indication may be shown.
