

# Update 1: Farmfoods recalls Qualiko Frozen Chicken Battered Premium Nuggets because of undeclared milk

Farmfoods is recalling Qualiko Frozen Chicken Battered Premium Nuggets because they contain milk which is not mentioned on the label. This means the product is a possible health risk for anyone with an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents. This alert has been updated to provide further details on the best before dates affected by this recall.

## Risk statement

## Action taken by the company

Farmfoods is recalling the above product from customers and has been advised to contact the relevant allergy support organisations, which will tell their members about the recall. The company has also issued a point-of-sale notice to its customers. These notices explain to customers why the product is being recalled and tell them what to do if they have bought the product.
