

# Krispy Kreme recalls White Chocolate & Raspberry Summer 4-pack of doughnuts because of undeclared peanuts

Krispy Kreme is recalling White Chocolate & Raspberry Summer 4-pack of doughnuts because it contains peanuts, which are not mentioned on the label. As a result of a packaging error, some packs have been incorrectly packed with two Reese's doughnuts which contain peanuts. This means the product is a possible health risk for anyone with an allergy to peanuts. The mispacked products also contain two original glaze doughnuts.

## Action taken by the company

Krispy Kreme is recalling the above product from customers and have been advised to contact the relevant allergy support organisations, which will tell their members about the recall. The company has also issued a point-of-sale notice to its customers (attached). These notices explain to customers why the product is being recalled and tell them what to do if they have bought the product.

## **About allergy alerts**

Sometimes there will be a problem with a food product that means it should not be sold. Then it might be 'withdrawn' (taken off the shelves) or 'recalled' (when customers are asked to return the product). Sometimes foods have to be withdrawn or recalled if there is a risk to consumers because the allergy labelling is missing or incorrect or if there is any other food allergy risk. When there is a food allergy risk, the FSA will issue an Allergy Alert.
