

# Co-op recalls Co-op Treat Brookie Bar because of undeclared milk

Co-op is recalling Co-op Treat Brookie Bar because it may contain milk, which is not mentioned on the label. This means the product is a possible health risk for anyone with an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents.

## Action taken by the company

Co-op is recalling the above product from customers and has been advised to contact the relevant allergy support organisations, which will tell their members about the recall. The company has also issued a point-of-sale notice to its customers. These notices explain to customers why the product is being recalled and tell them what to do if they have bought the product.

Instead, return the product to nearest Co-op store for a refund, with or without a receipt. ## About allergy alerts

Sometimes there will be a problem with a food product that means it should not be sold. Then it might be 'withdrawn' (taken off the shelves) or 'recalled' (when customers are asked to return the product). Sometimes foods have to be withdrawn or recalled if there is a risk to consumers because the allergy labelling is missing or incorrect or if there is any other food allergy risk. When

there is a food allergy risk, the FSA will issue an Allergy Alert.
