

# The Skinny Food Co recalls Skinny High Protein Low Sugar Duo Bars because of high levels of milk

The Skinny Food Co is recalling a variety of Skinny High Protein Low Sugar Duo Bars because they contain milk at higher levels than indicated on the label. This means the products are a possible health risk for anyone with an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents.

## Risk statement

### Allergen(s): Milk

These products contain higher levels of milk than indicated on the labelling, making them a possible health risk for anyone with an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents.

## Action taken by the company

The Skinny Food Co is recalling the above products from customers and have been advised to contact the relevant allergy support organisations, which will tell their members about the recall. The company has also issued a point-of-sale notice to its customers. These notices explain to customers why the products are being recalled and tell them what to do if they have bought any of the products.

## Our advice to consumers

If you have bought any of the above products and have an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents, do not eat them. Instead return them to the store from where they were bought for a full refund.

## About allergy alerts

Sometimes there will be a problem with a food product that means it should not be sold. Then it might be 'withdrawn' (taken off the shelves) or 'recalled' (when customers are asked to return the product). Sometimes foods have to be withdrawn or recalled if there is a risk to consumers because the allergy labelling is missing or incorrect or if there is any other food allergy risk. When there is a food allergy risk, the FSA will issue an Allergy Alert.
