White Rabbit Pizza is recalling White Rabbit Smokin Vegan Gluten Free Pizza, White Rabbit Vegan Gardener Gluten Free Pizza, White Rabbit Chick'n Arrabbiata Pizza and White Rabbit Chick'n & Pesto Calzone because they contain milk which is not mentioned on the label. This means the products are a possible health risk for anyone with an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents.

## Our advice to consumers

If you have bought the above products and have an allergy or intolerance to milk or milk constituents do not eat them. Instead return them to the store from where they were bought for a full refund.

### About allergy alerts

Sometimes there will be a problem with a food product that means it should not be sold. Then it might be 'withdrawn' (taken off the shelves) or 'recalled' (when customers are asked to return the product). Sometimes foods have to be withdrawn or recalled if there is a risk to consumers because the allergy labelling is missing or incorrect or if there is any other food allergy risk. When there is a food allergy risk, the FSA will issue an Allergy Alert.
